The most important outcome of this meeting will be negotiated and most probably approved by the High Level Participants. I am very pleased to announce that Turkey has already showed her support to the Agadir Declaration. I will be very happy to represent Turkey at this High Level Segment, hopefully together with the Turkey's Ambassador to Rabat, HE Ethem Barkan ÖZ. Turkey also supports the establishment of a Regional Mediterranean Initiative on FLR with a quantified and measurable target.

Distinguished Participants,

My Country, Turkey, supports the UN Activities in everywhere and every area. After hosting the World Forestry Congress, Turkey hosted UNFF10 in İstanbul and UNCCD COP12 in Ankara. FAO Subregional Office for Central Asia has been established in Ankara. The UNCCD Coordinating Unit for Northern Mediterranean Countries has been opened in Istanbul.

After the UNCCD COP 12, the Ankara Initiative with the aim of the activities for combatting desertification, land degradation and rehabilitation has been launched by Turkish Government. A memorandum of understanding has been signed between the Ministry of Forest and Water Affairs of Turkey and The Pan African Agency For The Great Green Wall.

The upcoming Agadir Commitment and Ankara Initiative have mutual aims and visions. In order to reach the Sustainable Development Goals, especially the target on land degradation neutrality, in order to reach more sustained and restored landscape, all the partners including private sector, civil societies, especially the trade unions must work together.

We need national, sub regional and regional/international networks to reach our goals and aims. No one, no party can do it without cooperation and coordination. Take back the degraded land is also a very good opportunity for job creations. Thus private sector should be supported by any means.

I am here to represent the Government of Turkey and as well as the Silva Mediterranea.

We have the representative of Oz Orman İş Trade Union. The number of members reach to 30.000 in the field of forestry. We have friends from Greener Turkey Foresters Association.

We have friends from the Foundation of the People Caring for Future- CARFU, which I am the Chair. CARFU also represents the PLANFOR (Platform of the Associations of Nature and Forestry) It has members from several countries including Kyrgyzstan, Turkey, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Albania.
