Title: Non-wood forest products for people, nature and the green economy. Recommendations for policy priorities in the Mediterranean

Content and format: this session is divided in three blocks.

The first block (30 minutes) introduces the linkage between entrepreneurship in NWFP and appropriate policies that allow these businesses to thrive, with special emphasis on the Turkish context. It includes a short presentation of the document *EU policy priorities for the sustainability of Non-Wood Forest Products: a white paper based on lessons-learned from around the Mediterranean.*

The second block (1 hour) presents five success cases on how adequate policies maintain the sustainability of NWFP value chains, secure competitive and equitable value chains, allow market transparency, data and information flow, and enable conditions for NWFP businesses to flourish.

Finally, the last block (45 min) is a joint debate of the sessions *Improving the value-chain of Mediterranean Wild Food Products (WFP): special insight into how certification, branding and labelling can upgrade the economic value of edible non wood forest products and Non-wood forest products for people, nature and the green economy. Recommendations for policy priorities in the Mediterranean. The two first blocks are oral presentations supported with audio-visual material. The third block is a moderated debate between the speakers and the audience.*

IMPORTANT: as being discussed and agreed between the organisers of this session and the organisers of the session *Improving the value-chain of Mediterranean Wild Food Products (WFP)*: special insight into how certification, branding and labelling can upgrade the economic value of edible non wood forest products (submitted by Marta Rovira, CTFC), we express our will host a common debate for both sessions. To facilitate this common debate, we highly suggest hosting both sessions back-to-back during the same half of the day (either as a whole morning or as a whole afternoon). This will allow attendees interested on NWFP to enjoy all the presentations and the debate around this topic in a timeslot of four hours, proposed as this:
